The MoU Partnership Facilitators have coordinated the delivery of several free Indigenous Business Skills Development Programs in regional locations across the State.

The program is delivered through a collaboration with staff from the business schools of University of New South Wales (UNSW), University of Sydney (USYD), Macquarie University (MQ) and James Cook University (JCU) and is supported by a range of partnering agencies, including: the Department of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships; the Office of Small Business; the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet; Indigenous Business Australia; Many Rivers; Supply Nation; the Black Business Finder and local Indigenous Chambers of Commerce.

The objective of the program is to support Indigenous businesses to build their skills and capability to take advantage of supply opportunities, particularly within the resources sector.
